You should be forever proud of the fine example your daughter set for the hundreds of young women serving their country and we shall always be grateful for her contribution to the Navy."

From Father David J. Kosky: "She was a devout Catholic and belonged to the Mary-Waves of which organization

she was Executive Vice President and a frequent Communicant."

From the Lt. Commander of the Naval Air Station, Patuxent River, Maryland: "During the temporary absence of our Catholic Chaplain, I feel that I should write you concerning Irene.". . . "We respected her for the fine young lady she always was, and for her valuable and indispensable contribution by her Catholic action and outstanding example. She never failed her religious duties and from personal observation I know that she was a frequent Communicant. Her superiors have nothing but the highest praise for her performance of duty as a Wave and a member of the United States Navy.' ... "Your daughter Irene has pased away in the prime of her life but I am sure her life on this earth has assured her a place among God's chosen ones."

FROM Paturent Naval Air. Station signed by five Lts. and an Ensign: "Irene was one of the finest Waves stationed at this Command. She obeyed instructions cheerfully and willingly, thereby aiding the morale of her shipmates.
