 Not to lie cold, yet sleep in snow.*

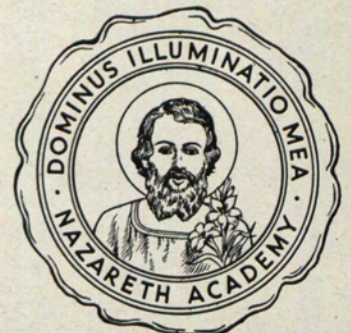

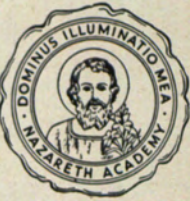

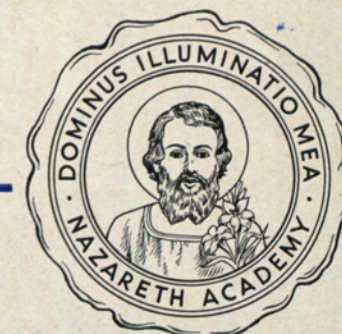

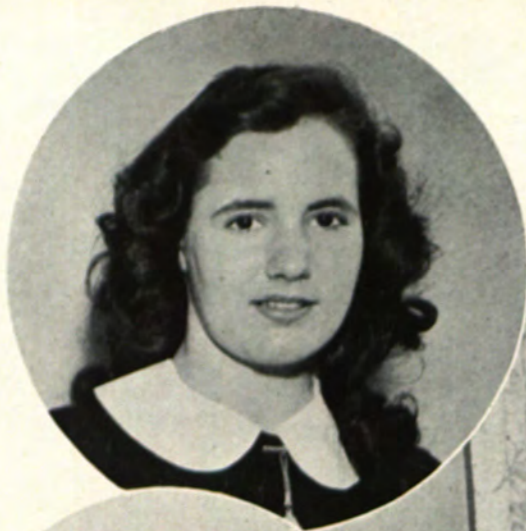

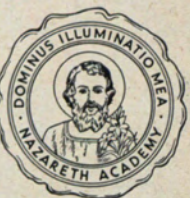

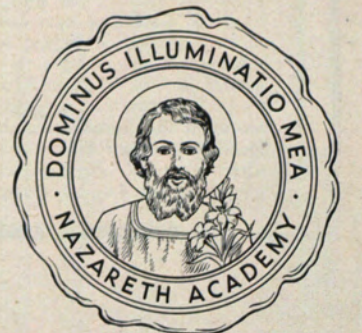

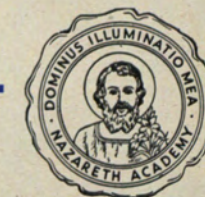

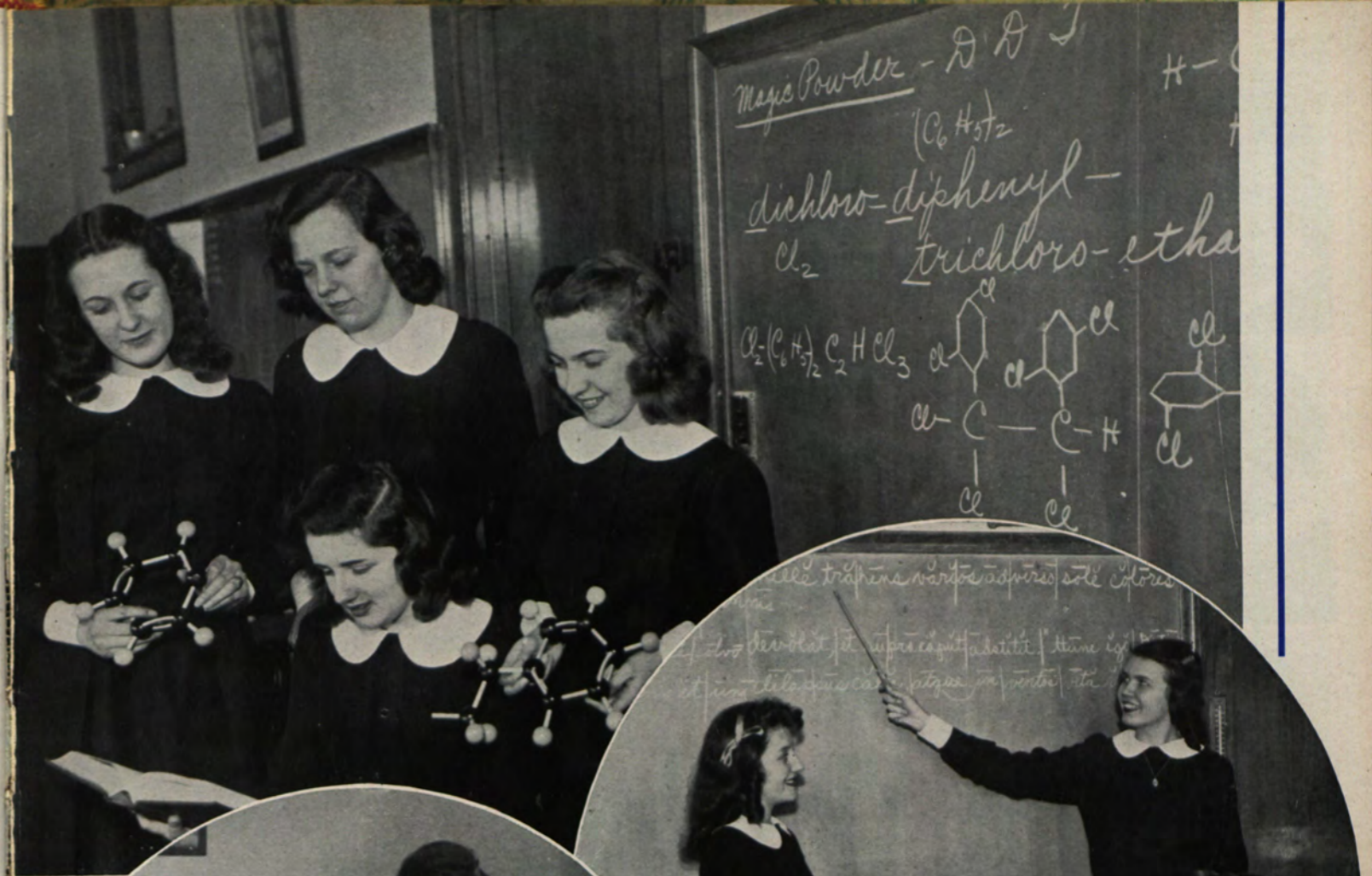

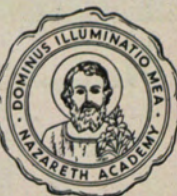

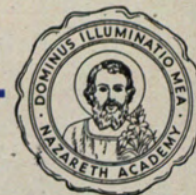

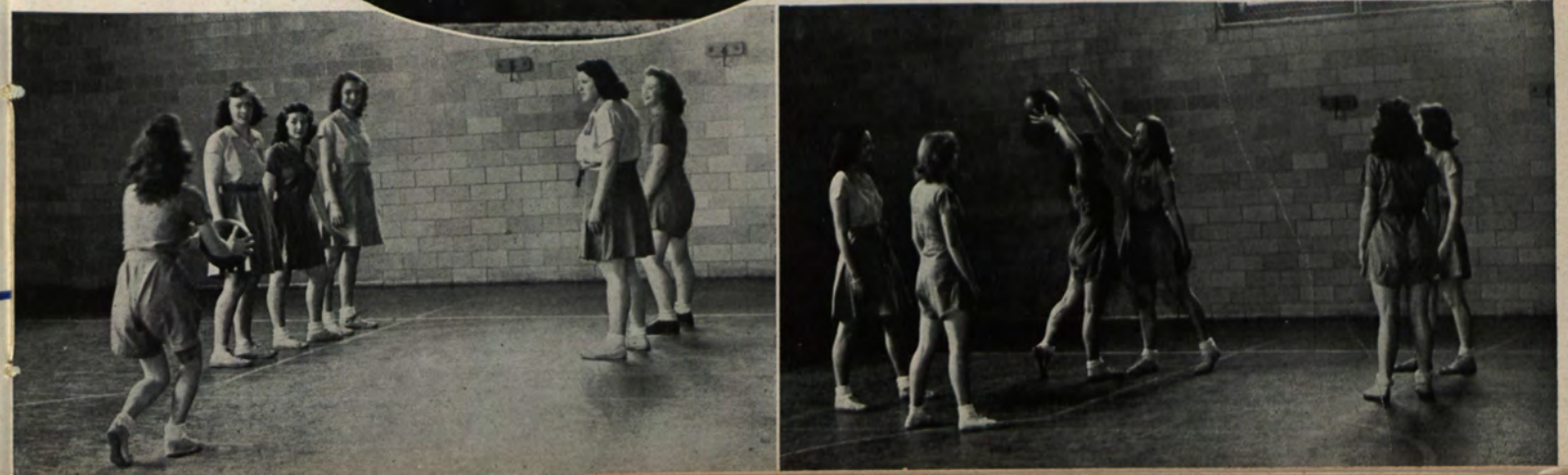

that is in their hearts for Mary their Mother, for their parents and for Nazareth.

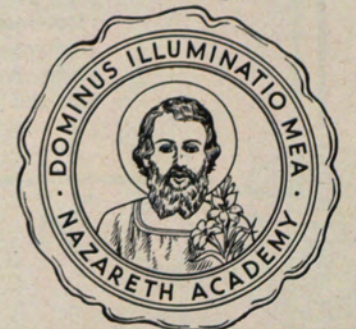
