How to Write to POWs

Washington —(AP)— The government has prepared a form for use by families trying to communicate with relatives who are prisoners of war in Korea or Communist China.

Announcing this yesterday, the Defense Department emphasized that so far the Reds have not supplied prisoner information through the International Red Cross.

The form to be used was prepared by the Post Office Department. It requires the name, rank

and serial number of the supposed prisoner. Letters must be addressed "Care of the Chinese People's Committee for World Peace, Peking, China."

No postage is required, but the words "prisoner of war mail" must be written in the upper right corner of the envelope.

Through June 8, 153 Americans were listed as prisoners and 10,211 as missing.
